Good- **better/best**

Well- **better/ best**

Bad- **worse/worst**

Much- **more**

Many - **most**

Little - **less/ least**

Far - **farther/ farthest - further / furthest**

Michael is a good guy, he is **better than** I thought.

Michael is **the best** guy at school.

Michael learns all the lessons well in the classroom, **better than** his classmates.

However Jessica is going bad at school, she is doing **worse than** last year.

Unfortunately the teacher of Jessica said she is **the worst** in her classroom.

Jessica has just a little time to study, **less time than** last year. She is the one with **the least** time to study.

Jessica lives far from school, **farther than** her classmates, she is the one who lives the **farthest**. This year Jessica is living **further** north, so she takes too long to get at school.

COMPARATIVE AND SUPERLATIVES - EXCEPTIONS 2 TWO SYLLABLE ADJECTIVES EITHER “ER” “EST” “MORE” AND “MOST”.

Quiet- **More** quiet/ **the most** quiet - quieter/ quietest

Polite- **More** Polite/ **the most** polite - politer / politest

Simple- **More** simple / **the most** simple- simpler / simplest

Friendly- **More** friendly / **the most** friendly - friendlier / friendliest

Lovely- **More** lovely / **the most** lovely - lovelier / loveliest

Lively - **More** lively / **the most** lively - livelier / liveliest

Michael doesn't speak much, he is **quieter than** I thought.

Michael is **the quietest** guy at school.

Michael is a polite guy, **politer than** his classmates.

Michael is **the politest** in his classroom.

The teacher of Jessica is **friendlier than** my teacher.

Jessica's teacher is **the friendliest**.

Jessica is **more lovely than** the other students, in fact she is **the loveliest** in my classroom.

The young guys are **more lively than** the older, they are **the liveliest**.
