

REAL VOCABULARY AT THE SUPERMARKET SCRIPT

- “*Grocery store*” é mais comum no inglês cotidiano que “*market*” ou “*supermarket*”, no geral. “*Market*” nos lembra de “*Farmer’s market*” que é uma feira que tipicamente temos uma vez por semana que é um mercado no ar livre.
- O “*Cashier*” vai querer fazer um bate-papo com você. Se você não está a fim ou não entende, só falar: “*I’m good.*”
- Alguns mercados não usam *plastic* mais, mas no geral, a pessoa vai te perguntar: “*Paper or plastic?*” para te perguntar se você quer que eles coloquem a sua comida em bolsas de papel ou de plástico. Em mercados mais chiques, ou se você estiver em San Francisco ou Portland, acho, pode ser que você teria que trazer sua própria bolsas. Na maioria dos lugares, você consegue um pequeno desconto (tipo 0.10) se trazer suas próprias bolsas.
- **PRO TIP:** Em muitos “*grocery stores*” vão perguntar se você tem um “*club card*” ou um “*rewards card*”. Se não tiver, vale a pena fazer um na hora, é só dar um endereço e *phone number*. Muitas vezes se você finge que tem um mas esqueceu o número, eles até passam um cartão deles na hora.

QUESTION / ANSWER

YOU: Do you guys have any condensed milk?

ASSITANT: Hm, condense milk... That's a good question. I'm not sure. What do you need it for?

YOU: I'm going to make a dessert.

ASSITANT: Well, we might have some in a can. Let's take a look on aisle 5.

YOU: What time do you guys close tonight?

ASSISTANT: We'll be open until 8:00.

YOU: Sorry, how much are these tomatoes? I don't see a price.

ASSISTANT: I'm not sure. If you go to the cashier, they can help you out.

YOU: How much is this coffee?

ASSISTANT: The price should be on the bottom of the bag. Do you see it?

YOU: Oh, yes, it's right here. Thank you!

YOU: I can't find the coffee filters. Are they near the coffee?

ASSISTANT: They should be. If they aren't, you can also check on aisle 8.

ASSISTANT: Alright, you all set?

YOU: Yes, all ready to go.

ASSISTANT: Hi there. Did you find everything alright?

YOU: Yes, thank you.

ASSISTANT: Do you have a club card?

YOU: No, I don't think so.

ASSISTANT: Do you want to sign up for one?

YOU: Not tonight, thanks.

ASSISTANT: Do you have a rewards card?

YOU: Yes, I do.

ASSISTANT: What's your phone number?

ASSISTANT: Paper or plastic?
