B: At the end of this course she **will have been studying** (*study*) English for six years.

g) A: How many countries has your sister visited during her journey?

B: I don't really know. But she **will have been backpacking** (backpack) the world for a year before she gets back home.

h) A: Do you like endless soap operas?

B: I love them. By the end of this year I will have been watching (watch) Guiding Light for two decades.

i) A: Is the chicken ready?

B: Not at all. At 12.30 I **will have been baking** (*bake*) it for ninety minutes and it is not ready yet!

j) A: Is tennis a tiring sport?

B: Tiring? Look at this match. They **will have been playing** (*play*) for more than three or four hours when it ends.

- j) Shall I turn off the gass? It will be 10.15 and the water has nearly been <u>boiling</u> for twenty minutes.
 Shall I turn off the gass? The water will have been boiling for twenty minutes at 10.15.
